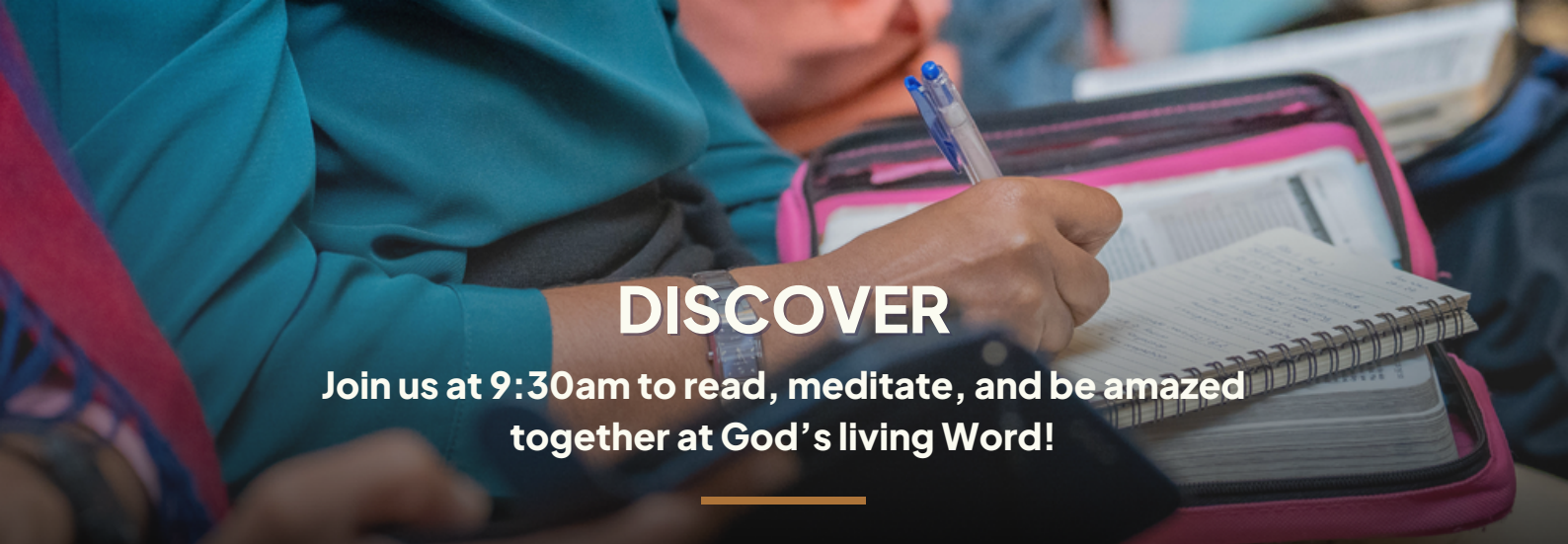

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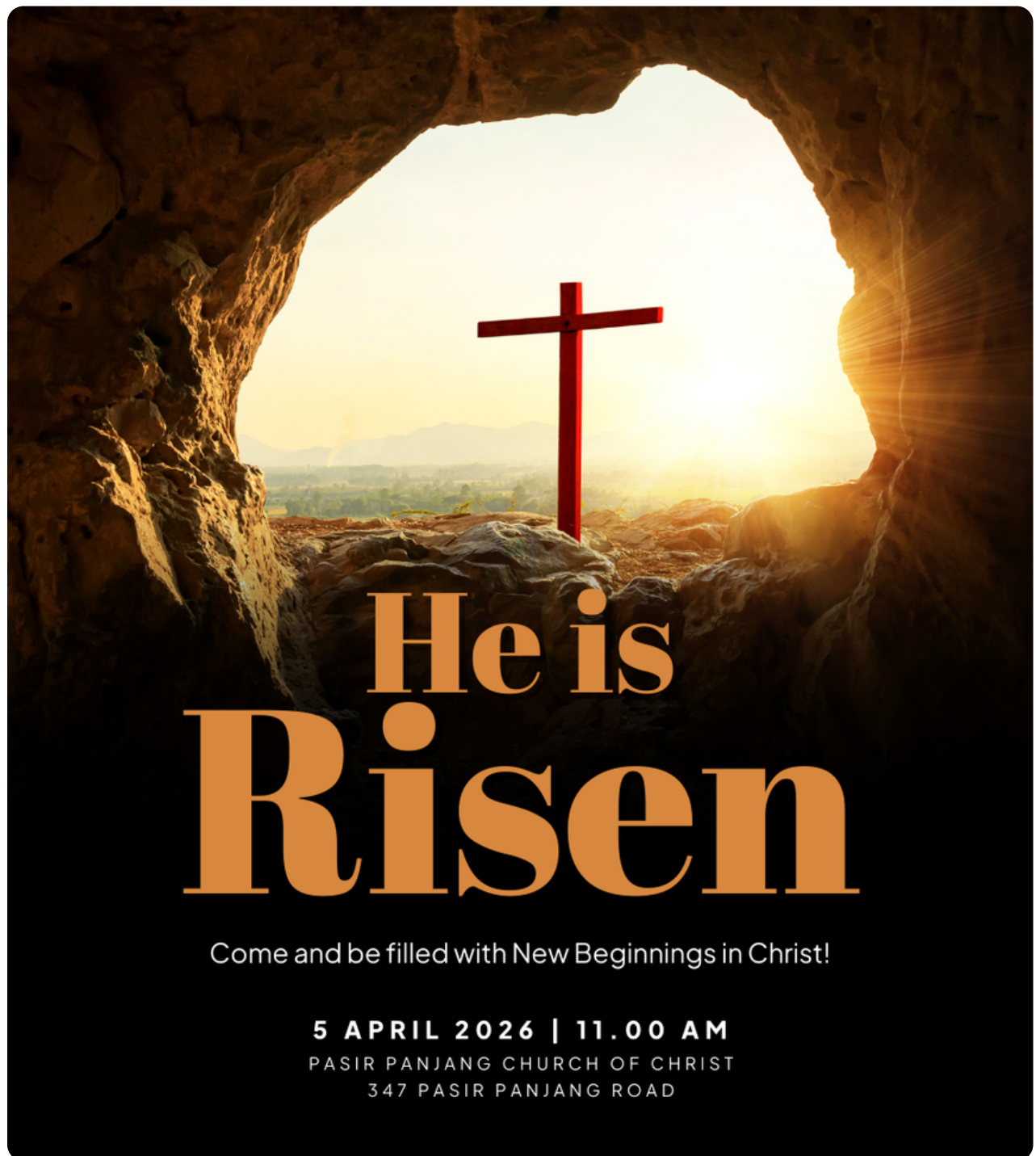
# Resurrection Sunday & Family Feast

### John Then – What God Is Doing In Nepal

#### ★ Strengthening Young Churches in Remote Villages

The Chepang congregations in Kalikatar, Bhumidarsi, and Nigurotar continue to grow in faith despite harsh terrain, unpredictable weather, and limited resources. Local disciple makers like Iskel Praja and Prabesh Chepang are faithfully leading worship, discipling believers, and planting new congregations in these communities. The team was deeply moved by the heartfelt a cappella worship, generous hospitality, and hunger for God's Word they witnessed among the believers there. As a tangible expression of care, 60 school bags were distributed to children — many of whom were receiving a proper school bag for the very first time.

#### ★ Encouraging the Visually Impaired Church in Pokhara

More than 20 visually impaired believers gathered for worship and fellowship, and their resilience and joy deeply encouraged the mission team. Leadership is emerging through preacher Milan Tamang and Nischal Choudhary, a visually impaired graduate of Nepal Bible College, both of whom are growing into their calling with quiet faithfulness. Fellowship meals shared together further strengthened the sense of unity and belonging within this remarkable congregation.

#### ★ Working in Families and Individuals

The team had the privilege of ministering to individuals and families at various points along the journey. They shared devotion and encouragement with a family of seven daughters, and connected with Raju K.C., a trekking guide and World English Institute student who is exploring faith. The team was also moved by the story of Bina Tamang, a daughter who lovingly and sacrificially cares for her elderly parents — a quiet picture of Christlike love lived out in the everyday.

#### ★ God is Shaping Leaders for the Future

At Baneshwor Church of Christ, leaders gathered for a teaching session from Mark 2, where they were challenged to reach the unreached with unity and a shared team spirit. There is a growing desire among these leaders for scriptural grounding and long-term partnership as they seek to bring the gospel to Nepal's many diverse ethnic groups. It was an encouraging sign of a church taking seriously its calling to the nations within its own borders.

#### ★ Protecting Vulnerable Children

Despite storms and hail along the way, the team made their way to an orphanage run by Sister Binita, who has been caring for vulnerable girls since she herself was just 16 years old. She now oversees 75 children, many of whom have been rescued from the risks of trafficking. The team spent time singing songs and sharing joy and encouragement with the children, leaving with a profound sense of having witnessed God's own compassion at work through one woman's extraordinary faithfulness.

### Tan Beng Chuan – The Disciple-Making Economy in Nepal

Evangelist Pramod Dhakal offered a timely reminder that disciple-making is the command of Jesus. His training among unreached groups is already bearing fruit, most visibly in the small but growing four-member church in Kalikatar Village within the Chepang community of Chitawan.

What struck us was the realisation that our Nepali brethren had been faithfully living out this "disciple-making economy" long before we arrived. We come as partners to join what God is already doing, walking alongside them in expanding this witness across more communities.

Please pray for strength and encouragement for our Nepali brethren as they continue in faithful service. Ask God to multiply their disciple-making efforts and to continue seeking His guidance for our partnership with them, that the gospel may reach further into the unreached of Nepal.

### Donald and Helen Siew

We first met Pramod at AMF in Cebu in 2019. On this trip, we were encouraged to witness his passion for the gospel and his commitment to supporting and encouraging the church.

Our visit to the Chepang community was a meaningful experience. They are a simple and joyful people, content with what they have.

Meeting the visually impaired believers deeply touched us. Although they could not see, they joyfully lifted their voices in praise and made the effort to attend worship independently.

We were also encouraged by the local church, where the leaders are eager to learn about God's word.

The visit to the orphanage was also a highlight. The children are well cared for and cheerful. Binita's love and dedication in nurturing them is truly commendable. We pray that God will continue to bless her and her husband as they faithfully serve and bring hope to these children.

Our takeaways: renewed faith, simplicity, gratitude, and a changed perspective. Thank You, God, for this opportunity to witness Your work among the unreached in Nepal and strengthening our faith. Amen.

The trip to Kalikatar to visit the Chepang community was hard. We drove in a 4WD for an hour over winding mountain roads and through dry riverbeds filled with big, rocky stones. The ride was bumpy and very uncomfortable. It made me realize just how difficult it is to reach the people living deep in these mountains.

I am truly encouraged by one brother who became Christian first in this community and now with the help of another 2 brothers from Bro Pramod's team, they are going into the community weekly to share the gospel and more are responding to the good news. I am reminded of the 'Harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few'. May the Lord of harvest raise up more workers for the field.
